We're delighted to share that Cool-L-Food won gold at the Regiostar awards 2020, making it the second year running that an FCE project has won this prestigious award.

The Regiostars are Europe's award to EU-funded projects which demonstrate excellence and new approaches in regional development.

Cool-L-Food, an FCE micro-project, won the 'Circular Economy for a Green Europe' category and was recognised for its fun, smart and innovative approach to encouraging citizens to make more sustainable food choices.

100% intervention rate confirmed

Against the backdrop of Covid-19, projects have faced unprecedented challenges this year. As such, we have been working behind the scenes to secure additional support for projects.

The FCE programme team is pleased to announce 100% intervention funding for the period 1 July 2020 to 30 June 2021 for claims paid by the Certifying Authority within that period. This is subject to eligibility conditions including state aid, de minimis and in kind.

We are also launching a call for any capitalisation projects, which will be 100% funded, specifically focused on Covid-19 related recovery activities.

Five new projects approved

Five new projects were approved by the English and French delegations at the September committee meeting, which brings us to a total of 44 projects approved over the lifetime of the programme. The latest projects are highlighted below:

- Water for Tomorrow will design and implement new management systems to increase climate change resilience in water stressed catchments in East Anglia, Bretagne and Hauts-de-France.
- Revert the cross-border project, combining world-leading experts in Amiens and Cambridge, will develop innovative medical tools to rapidly and accurately diagnose patients with a form of dementia known as normal pressure hydrocephalus.
- Circle will develop a new type of permeable surface, which is cost effective and has low environmental impact, to improve water drainage in towns and cities increasingly at risk of flooding
- Firedrone aims to increase the safety, speed and accuracy of firefighters' response to industrial fires and wildfires by developing a compact airborne robotic system to monitor dangerous smoke emissions in real-time
- UNESCO Sites Across the Channel will introduce a sustainable model of tourist development to UNESCO sites on both sides of the Channel, to manage increased tourism demand and create new business opportunities and jobs.
