As 2021 comes to a close, we reflect on the past year and set our sights on 2022.

This year was special for us as we reached our €223m commitment target for the programming period. A total of 51 projects and 420 partners are now part of the Interreg France (Channel) England programme.

The last quarter has been incredibly busy for the Programme. We hosted our annual event with seven of our projects showcased at our participatory lab on digital transitions held at EU Regions Week.

In October, we launched a COP26 social media campaign highlighting how our projects act on mitigating and adapting to climate change. And our two Interreg Volunteer Youth (IVY) Reporters published policy articles on the EU's Interreg Highlights blog covering the green transition and sustainable tourism.

Despite the challenges presented by Covid-19, it has been a very fruitful year and we wish all our projects a healthy and prosperous Christmas and New Year!

Funds available now for project modifications

We are pleased to announce that funds are available for project modifications.

If you wish to submit a fundamental modification the deadline to apply is **Friday 18 February 2022**. Before applying, please ensure you have read the programme rules set out in Guidance Note 6a of the <u>Programme Manual</u>, the <u>eMS Modification Request guidance</u> as of the <u>additional principles document</u> we have prepared. The documents are available under the resources section of our website.

Please note that project modifications will be assessed by the Joint Secretariat on a 'first come, first served basis', before being submitted to the PMC for decision. If you have any questions regarding the funds or the process for applying, please speak to your project officer.



TIGER reaches key milestones in the development of tidal stream energy

This Autumn **TIGER**, the biggest Interreg project ever, reached major milestones in its mission to accelerate tidal stream energy in the UK and France.

TIGER's tests at the Paimpol-Bréhat (Brittany) tidal energy site ended in September, with the disconnection of its 1MegaWatt turbine. Building on this experience, new turbines will be constructed in 2023 and installed at the Raz-Blanchard (Normandy) site in 2025.

Institutional breakthroughs of key importance for TIGER were also achieved, with a Memorandum of Understanding signed between the Syndicat des Energies Renouvelables (SER) and the UK Marine Energy Council.

In addition, the UK Government announced its biggest investment in a generation into tidal stream energy. This was a significant boost for project TIGER, given that one of the projects key objectives is secure buy-in for tidal energy and it has been calling for a ring-fenced amount dedicated to tidal stream energy in governmental investment plans.
