Programme Update

Welcome to the March edition of the Interreg France (Channel) England programme newsletter.

This was an intense start of the year for all of us with several projects taking off and many other ones scheduled to close within the next weeks and months. This also was an active period at Programme level with several changes within the management team.

Fundamental modifications approved

On the occasion of the latest Programme Monitoring Committee meeting on 22 March 2022, 12 fundamental modification requests were approved by the delegations. We congratulate projects Circle, Flower, Revert, Firedrone, Increase VS AWE, Blueprint, ReCon Soil, Tiger, Marineff, USAC and Experience and look forward to seeing further achievements in the course of their lifetime.

Joint Secretariat updates

CobBauge reaches crucial phase

We reported earlier this year on project **CobBauge** whose two prototype houses in Devon and Normandy are expected to be completed this Spring.

This is a key development for the project which aims to develop the use of cob – a mix of soil, clay and straw – as a new low energy construction material for houses in both France and the UK.

It has taken years of research to get to this point, with the team experimenting with six French soil types and six British ones, as well as with six different types of fibre.

Stakes are high during this process as CobBauge relies on performance and usage data from the prototypes to make a strong case for the construction of cob houses in the Channel area.

Project Spotlight – VISTA AR used technology to create new heritage tourism experiences

On the occasion of the closure of project **VISTA AR**, we conducted an interview with Laura Dixon, Project Manager, and Florence Menu, Project Coordinator.

VISTA AR introduced new technologies such as Augmented Reality (AR) and Virtual Reality (VR) to small and medium cultural heritage sites, that would not otherwise have had the budget or resources to use them – in order to diversify its public and increase their revenue.

Multiple kinds of immersive solutions have been developed in deployment sites across the France Channel England area as the project also brought more accessibility to culture following the outbreak of the pandemic.
